If the reviews are not positive, we might still consider the submission for the following category.
- Work in progress. To present ongoing work. Review of the abstract. If accepted, you are invited to give an oral presentation at the symposium and an extended abstract or full paper (your choice) will be published in the digital proceedings of the symposium.
- **Showcases.** Live presentations of products and developments. Showcase presenters can submit an extended abstract or full paper for the digital proceedings of the symposium, as long as it is scientific. Please contact us for individual arrangements.
